We recommend for the work:

white Zweigart Aida 16 count, woolen and acrylic RIOLIS threads (6 colors), a needle.

Size of the folded pincushion 10,5x8 cm.

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





Please read the manual to avoid mistakes!

- Cut the canvas into two equal parts with the size of 20,5x26 cm.
- Make the embroidery according to the chart on one piece. Second part will be the inner side of the pincushion.
- First it is advisable to find the center of the canvas (T2). Combine it with the design center, shown by arrows on the chart.
- The work is made with a cross-stitch in 2 woolen threads. The work will look good if all upper stitches are inclined in one direction (T3). Try to avoid making knots. At the beginning, fasten off your thread by doing several stitches over the fabric that afterwards will be hidden by the embroidery. In following put the thread end under the stitches on the reverse side to fasten it off (T4).
- Fold two parts of the pincushion faced inside and sew them by a sewing machine or using a backstitch, leaving the hole for turning inside out (marked in the diagram with two black strokes). You can pin the details for not being displaced or sew them with a running stitch.
- Cut off the excess of the canvas at a distance of about 7 mm from the seam (in a place of the hole leave the allowance about 2 cm).
- In narrow places, cut the allowances with scissors, otherwise the seam will be tightened.
- Turn the pincushion inside out, straighten the seams, stuff the pincushion with a polyester or a cotton wool. Sew the remaining hole using a blind stitch.
- Twist a little cord (T5). To make it, cut 20 light beige threads of 1.2 m. Divide them into two leas of 10 threads. Bundle the resulting leas up, and then twist the forming lea of 2.4 m long tightly in opposite directions. Pull the knot while holding the ends of the lea and put it together carefully. This will lead to twisting.
- Sew the little cord to the pincushion contour.
- Quilt the pincushion (T6) with running stitch, backward filling the gaps between the stitches to make a continuous stitch (T7). To form a more embossed edge while making stitches, we advise you to grab the fringing little cord with a few whipstitches.
- You can make a loop for hanging (see the cover) from the little cord left after the edging. Put the pincushion in half.
- Our advice. To decorate the pincushion, you can sew a large pearly bead to the inside.
